Oklahoma Children's Theatre brought five remarkable productions to the stage this year topping over 70 total performances, featuring both professional actors and Young Company casts. The season included Junie B. Jones is Not a Crook, a hilarious story about honesty and friendship; The Snowy Day and Other Stories by Ezra Jack **Keats**, capturing the magic of a child's first snowfall; Dr Suess' The Cat in the Hat, a whimsical tale about imagination and responsibility; **The** SpongeBob Musical: Youth Edition, celebrating friendship and inclusion; and **Annie Jr.**, a timeless story of resilience and optimism. Targeting Pre-K through 6th graders, OCT's productions included weekday field trip performances as well as weekend shows for families.

To extend the magic of theater to more children, OCT partnered with local nonprofits, providing 75 complimentary tickets to children from *Positive Tomorrows* and *Woven Life*. Additionally, discounted group rates allowed OCT to welcome 64 school, day care & home school groups to attend productions at a reduced cost, broadening access to live theatre for young audiences.

OUTREACH

In Fall 2023. Oklahoma Children's Theatre toured *Totally True Tall Tales*, an imaginative play where students actively participated in creating folktales. This tour included 15 performances across 14 cities, reaching 3,061 students and 286 school staff. Each student who attended a performance received an activity book designed to support English Language Arts curriculum in a creative way. With additional

funding for this tour, OCT was able to return to two schools to lead literacy-based workshops centered around the play. These workshops explored key story elements such as settings, character development, and sequencing. Every student received a Tall Tales book and teachers received a classroom anthology. In total these workshops reached 347 students and 19 teachers.

In Spring 2024, OCT premiered Oklahoma's *Own*, an original play celebrating famous Oklahomans and the state's rich history. This tour included 20 performances across 16 towns, engaging 5,186 students and 396 teachers. Workbooks supporting literacy skills such as reading comprehension and vocabulary were also distributed to the students during this tour. A special highlight from the **Oklahoma's Own** performances was OCT's participation in the Week of the Young Child in Miami, Oklahoma, hosted by the Quapaw Nation and funded by The Nine Tribes. Additionally, OCT's Come Play

with Me In-School Residency **Program** served 159 Pre-K students and 18 teachers at Horace Mann Pre-K Center and *Hawthorne Elementary* School, introducing early literacy through stories and dramatic play. Each classroom received two interactive lessons, and every student was gifted copies of the books Bear Snores On and Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed.

This year marked the conclusion of the agency's three-year afterschool program at Eugene Field Elementary School, funded by an ESSER grant. Focused on reading and arts-based activities, the program ran for 14 weeks each semester. supporting literacy growth for 1st-4th graders. Fall and Spring semesters served 42 and 39 students respectively, providing snacks, enriching lessons, homework assistance, and transportation. Overall, this program supported 29 paid positions for local artists and teachers.

Oklahoma Children's Theatre's outreach programs continue to make a meaningful impact by expanding access to arts programming for students across the state. These initiatives foster creativity and encourage a lifelong love of learning at no cost to the students or the schools.

CAMPS

Oklahoma Children's Theatre was thrilled to offer a full year of dynamic camps, giving children opportunities to explore their creativity and discover new talents. Through the camp programs, OCT employed 78 Teaching Artists, many of whom had previously attended OCT camps as children themselves. With 12 weeks of summer camp, along with winter and spring break camps, these programs catered to a diverse range of interests, from theatre and dance to filmmaking and magic. Designed for ages 5-16, OCT's camps foster teamwork, selfexpression, and imagination, ensuring every child finds a place to shine.









Each week-long camp is grouped by age rather than experience, allowing expert instructors to tailor classes to the unique talents of their students. This past year, popular camps included **Broadway Jr., Podcast Production**, Swiftie Camp, and Pokémon Camp. All camps featured theater warmups, show devising, rehearsals, interactive activities, and a final performance, where children collaborated to create entertaining and often hilarious plays.

Children from OCT's summer camps enjoyed complimentary performances of *The* SpongeBob Musical: Youth Edition and Annie **Jr.** performed by OCT's Young Company actors as well as OCU's Performing Arts Academy's production of *The SpongeBob Musical*.





In FY24, OCT offered over 90 camp options, with 58 children participating in winter break camps, 75 in spring break camps, and 787 during the summer, resulting in a total of 1,384 enrollments, as many children enrolled in multiple sessions.

To ensure accessibility, OCT provided scholarships that allowed children to attend camps at a reduced rate. Thanks to generous contributions, these scholarships were offered on a sliding scale, decreasing tuition by 20% to 90%—with the average recipient receiving a 70% waiver. Over the past year, OCT awarded more than \$10,634 in scholarships, allowing more children to experience the joy and enrichment of camp programming.

CLASSES

OCT provided a variety of exciting after-school classes for children ages 3-16 this past year, giving them opportunities to dive into creative exploration and collaborative storytelling. In Fall 2023, classes included engaging favorites such as Creative Drama with Bluey, My Magical Zoo, Night at the Museum, Comedy Club, and more. This momentum carried into Spring 2024 with offerings such as Storytime Jam, The Wonderful World of Dr. Seuss, and Scenes from The Day the Internet Died.





Both sessions were designed to foster a love of the arts, with each class tailored to a specific age group, ensuring that every child could build confidence and skills in a supportive environment.

In Fall 2023, OCT served 73 children, with five out of seven

classes reaching full capacity. Similarly, in Spring 2024, 46 students participated, with three of the four classes filled to the maximum enrollment.

All classes emphasize teamwork, creative brainstorming, and memorization, culminating in a final performance where students eagerly showcase their accomplishments. these programs not only provide an artistic outlet for children but also foster essential skills that benefit them both in and out of the classroom.
